
The GAINS Global Trials Forum V will be held in May 2022. Date and time TBD.


Development and International Testing of a Multi-user Health-Tech Application for the Language Screening Tool (LAST): Advancing Care of Stroke Patients, presented by:

Heather Flowers, MEd, MHSc, PhD, School of Rehabilitation Sciences, University of Ottawa.

DOUBT2, a pragmatic, randomized controlled trial designed to test the effectiveness of aspirin after a transient neurological event with a brain MRI brain negative for acute ischemia. The study will examine whether the benefits of aspirin (prevention of recurrent strokes, myocardial infarction etc.) outweigh the risks (bleeding), shared by **Shelagh Coutts, MSc, BSC, MBChB, MD, FRCPC,** Departments of Clinical Neurosciences, Radiology and Community Health Sciences, University of Calgary.
