The second GAINS Global Trials Forum took place on 17-May, 2021. Just as previous forums, the feedback was extremely positive.

The four trials presented were very engaging and robust discussion followed each presentation:

Magdy Selim, from Beth Israel Deaconess in Boston, MA, shared StATins Use in intRacerebral hemorrhage patieNts (SATURN), exploring possible international expansion.

Rohit Bhatia, from All India Institute of Medical Sciences in New Delhi, India, presented RE-OPEN: Randomised Trial of Biosimilar TNK Versus TPA during Endovascular Therapy For Acute Ischemic Stroke Due To Large Vessel Occlusions.

Mohammad Wasay, from Aga Khan University in Karachi, Pakistan, shared his proposal, CILOSTAZOL FOR THE PREVENTION OF STROKE IN TUBERCULOUS MENINGITIS: A RANDOMIZED DOUBLE-BLIND PLACEBO CONTROLLED CLINICAL TRIAL

Aihua Liu, from the Beijing Neurosurgical Institute, China, is the PI of Subarachnoid aneurysm endovascular (SANE) cohort study in China: the protocol of a prospective multicentre registry, which Dr. Chen presented.
